Main characters:

Jan Andersen – a poor mercenary from Skruliuca. *Katrina* – Clara's mother. Clara Giula - Jan Andersen and Katrina's daughter.

Plot: The novel begins when Jan Andersen, a poor mercenary from Skruliuca, one day is going to become a father of a newborn baby who is going to be born by his completely unloved wife Katrina. Just after taking the daughter in his arms, Jan felt the awakening of love in his heart and the girl started to give him endless joy. From then the adventures of Jan and Clara start. One day a man invades their house and says that the man who gave them this house has died and he wants to get a hundred thalers deposit by October or else he's going to destroy the house they live in. When the man leaves Clara asks her father for permission to go explore the world and earn some money for her parents. With the parents' consent, Klara Giula leaves her hometown and decides to go to Stockholm. Being abroad Clara earns the money for her parents and sends it to them but she doesn't come back and her father begins to live with fantasy and waiting alone for fifteen years for his "little girl" to return. He

raises his daughter in his mind until she becomes the queen of Portugal for him in his mind and the world of his fantasies overshadows reality. Over time he completely loses his mind and considers himself as the King of Portugal. However, when Clara returns, not as a little girl, but as an adult and changed woman, her mother is disappointed to see Clare Giula again, because she is ugly and unpleasant, but quickly reconciles to reality. When Klara Giula returns to her hometown, she returns to her beloved father to pick him up with her mother but she finds a crazy man instead. So, none of them can turn time back. Clara tries to escape from her crazy father. However, as she tries to escape with her mother and leave her father alone, his mind drops completely and he no longer wants to suffer and jumps to the deep seabed. Her mother is very angry at Clara for forcing her to flee together, but she suddenly gets sick and lying in her deathbed forgives her daughter. After Jan's death, Clara remembers the image of her father from her childhood. Well, after reconciling with the death of her parents, Clara Giula becomes amazingly beautiful woman again, because it clarifies her soul and she stars to love her father the same as she used to when she was a child. Life returns to the world where love and harmony reign.

My opinion: In my opinion this book is very emotional but I really liked it. I rate it 10 out of 10.







Philip Pullman "Northern Lights / The Golden Compass"

FIRST PUBLISHED IN 1995



Characters:

Lyra Belacqua and *Pantalaimon*: Lyra is a 12-year-old girl with blue eyes and blond hair. She is brave and curious. Her demon is Pantalaimon, shortly Pan. As Lyra is still a child, Pan is still capable of changing into any shape he wishes. Lyra has been prophesied by the witches to help the balance of life.

Lord Asriel: Lyra's uncle, but he is actually her father. His demon is a snow leopard.

Marisa Coulter: an intelligent and beautiful, but also ruthless woman. She is Lyra's mother. Her demon is a golden monkey.

Plot: The story takes place in a mystical world ruled by Magisterium, pictured like a world-wide church. People's souls exist outside the human bodies in the shape of their demons - different kinds of animals. Children's demons can change their shapes; the adults' demons can't.

Lyra Belacqua lives in Jordan college, in Oxford. One day she secretly learns from Lord Asriel about a parallel universe seen through the Northern Lights in a concentration of Dust. Suddenly

Lyra's best friend Roger disappears, and most likely he is kidnapped by a secret organization, as lots of other children are. Marisa takes Lyra to London, and before the trip Lyra gets an alethiometer, a strange truth-telling gadget, which is almost impossible to maintain, but she quickly learns to use it intuitively. However, Lyra finds out that her mother Marisa is one of the leaders of the secret organization and tricks her. She joins the Gipsy tribe and travels on their ship to the North to release Roger and other kidnapped children from prison.

On her trip she helps polar bear Jorek to recapture his magic armour, which keeps him immortal. The he becomes the most devoted Lyra's friend and faithful defender. Guided by the alethiometer, Lyra arrives at a village and discovers an abandoned child who has been cut from his demon and who soon dies. She reveals the organization are experimenting on children by cutting the bond between human and demon. Lyra is captured and taken to Bolvangar, where she is briefly reunited with Roger before being separated from Pantalaimon.

In Svalbard, Asriel works on his Dust research in exile. He tells Lyra all he knows of Dust: that it has separated parallel universes, and the Church believes it is the basis of sin. Asriel gets on top of a mountain with Roger as Lyra and Iorek and his group of bears fight with the witches that are allied with Asriel. Mrs Coulter and her troops arrive in a military airship and attack the bears. Suddenly, Lord Asriel severs Roger from his demon, killing Roger but releasing an enormous amount of energy that tears a hole in the Northern Lights into a parallel universe, through which he walks. Lyra and Pantalaimon also pass through the hole in the sky.

My opinion: I liked Pullman's writing style. The story seems simple and clear to understand but at the same time it's full of symbols and makes you overthink the events again and again. The book tells a brilliant tale. It's amazing to think that there could possibly be a world where demons exist.

Recommendation: I recommend this book for teenagers who like fantasy stories.


Main characters:

Felix – a nine-year-old Jewish boy living in an orphanage in the mountains during WW2.

Zelda – a girl who has lost her parents. Felix finds her fainted in the burning house.

Barni – an adult who looks after the children like Felix and Zelda and hides them from the Nazis.

Plot: Poland, Year 1942. Felix Salinger has spent three years in an orphanage. His Jewish parents left him there at the beginning of World War 2 when he was six to keep safe from the Nazis and



promised to take him back as soon as they take care of their book-selling business. Time flies, and Felix starts to invent stories with his parents as the main characters.

One day a car arrives at the orphanage, and Felix thinks it is his parents; he is surprised to see men wearing bands on their arms. One of the nuns calls them "Nazis." When the men empty the orphanage library and burn the books, Felix thinks his parents are in danger and sneaks out of the orphanage to warn them. On his way to his native village the boy sees lots of empty houses. So is his house, when Felix arrives. One of the neighbours warns him that all the Jews have been taken to the train station to deliver to the concentration camp. Felix heads there to find his parents.

On his way he sees a burning house and saves a six-year-old girl, Zelda. She cries for her parents, but Felix comforts her telling one of his stories. Eventually, the Nazis find him and Zelda and force them to join a crowd of the Jews. The kids are saved by Barney, a dentist, who is in good relationship with the Nazis and takes care of some other Jewish children in his basement. Felix helps Barney during the operations: he tells the patients funny stories to distract them from pain.

At nights Felix and Barney search empty houses for drugs and aspirin. One night they return and find out that the Nazis have discovered their shelter. They are all taken to the train.

Children find a small hole in the wall, so Felix and Zelda decide to escape. Luckily, the Nazis don't shoot them. Together, they wonder what the destiny has prepared for them.

My opinion: This is a story of Holocaust told as one boy's life story. It proves that there always are people who can sacrifice their lives helping others (like Barney). It's a strong book, and sometimes it touched me deeply.

Recommendation: This book might be interesting to those young people who are keen on learning more about the history of WW2 and Holocaust.

Frances Hodgson Burnett "The Secret Garden"

Main characters:

Mary Lennox – a spoilt girl, who was born into a wealthy British family in British India.


Archibald Craven – Mary's uncle.

Martha Sowerby – Mary's maid.

Dickon – Marta's brother.

Colin – Mary's cousin, Archibald's son.

Plot: At the beginning of the 20th century, a lovely girl Mary is born into a wealthy Lennox family in British India. However, the girl is neglected by both parents and spoilt by the servants. Cholera epidemic kills her parents, and she stays alone in the abandoned house, where the British soldiers find her. She is soon sent to England to live with her uncle,



Archibald Craven, who appears to live in a huge country house with a locked garden.

Mary is rude and unfriendly, as usual. She hates the house and the people in it. But later she makes friends with her maid, Martha, who tells her that Mr Archibald's wife Lilias nourished the garden but she died at the accident there ten years ago. Then Archibald locked the garden door and buried the key. Mary becomes interested in the garden, spends more time in the fresh air and becomes stronger and happier. However, sometimes at night she can hear someone crying loudly in the house.

Exploring the gardens of the manor, Mary finds the garden key buried in the soil. She asks Martha for gardening tools and together with Dickon learns gardening secrets. Once she tells him about the secret garden.

One night, Mary hears the cries once more and decides to follow them through the house. She finds a boy of similar age named Colin, who lives in a hidden bedroom. They are cousins, Colin is the son of Archibald, and he suffers from serious disease which precludes him from walking. He is similar to Mary, self-centered and spoilt. Mary visits him every day that week, tells him about the moor, Dickon and the secret garden. Mary assures him she could enter the secret garden, and Colin asks to see it. Mary and Dickon put Collin into his wheelchair and bring outside into the secret garden.


While in the garden, the children look up to see Ben Weatherstaff looking over the wall on a ladder. He admits that he believed Colin to be "a cripple." Angry with these words, Colin stands up from his chair and finds that his legs are fine, but weak. Colin and Mary soon spend almost every day in the garden, sometimes with Dickon as company. The children and Ben conspire to keep Colin's recovering health a secret from the other staff as to surprise his father, who is travelling abroad.

When Mr. Archibald receives a letter from Mrs. Sowerby, he finally returns home. He finds the garden door unlocked and is shocked to see the garden in bloom and his son healthy. The children tell him the whole story, and Archibald and Colin walk back to the manor together.

My opinion: I was a bit sorry about Mary and Colin. They are kids raised away from their parents, who have received all the things they could want or need, except for parents' love and attention. Imagine how it must be to grow up experiencing that, and even worse, to receive that impression from your parents, the grown-ups that are supposed to love you and protect you. The author gives us some hope: it is never too late to make things right and to forgive.

Recommendation: I would recommend this book for people who care for nature, as there are a lot of descriptions of flowers and trees. Adults might think about the way they behave with their kids and about the mistakes they make.

Lois Lowry "The Giver"

FIRST PUBLISHED IN 1993

Main characters: Jonas – an eleven-year-old boy with a special gift.

The Giver – an adult man who is very wise and world-weary, and he is haunted by memories of suffering and pain.

Jonas's Father – a Nurturer, who feels strong bond with the newborn babies he cares for.

Jonas's mother- a strict woman, and her job involves punishing citizens who break the community's rules.

Plot: Jonas, an eleven-year-old boy, lives in a future society without any

pain, war, and hatred. Everyone looks and behaves the same. At age of twelve every member of the community is assigned a job based on his or her abilities and interests. Citizens can apply for and are assigned a spouse, and each couple is assigned exactly two children. The children are born to Birthmothers, who never see them, and spend their first year in a Nurturing Center with other babies born that year. When their children are grown, family units dissolve and adults live together with Childless Adults until they are too old to function in the society. Then they spend their last years being cared for in the House of the Old until they are finally "released" from the society. In the community, release is death, but it is never described that way.

Jonas lives with his father, a Nurturer of new children, his mother, who works at the Department of Justice, and his seven-year-old sister Lily. Though he is a well-behaved citizen and a good student, Jonas is different: he has pale eyes, while most people in his community have dark eyes. Sometimes objects "change" when he looks at them. He does not know it yet, but he alone in his community can perceive flashes of color.

At the Ceremony, Jonas is given the Assignment of Receiver of Memory. The Receiver is the sole keeper of the community's collective memory. When the community went over to Sameness, it erased all memories of pain and emotion, but the memories cannot disappear totally. Someone must keep them so that the community can avoid making the mistakes of the past. Jonas receives the memories of the past from the current Receiver, a wise old man who tells Jonas to call him the Giver. The Giver transmits memories by placing his hands on Jonas's bare back. The first memory he receives is of a sled ride. As Jonas receives memories from the Giver he realizes how empty life in his community really is. The memories make Jonas's life richer and more meaningful, and he wishes that he could give it to the people he loves. But since they have never experienced real suffering, they also cannot appreciate the real joy of life. Jonas grows more and more frustrated with the members of his community, and the Giver encourages him. The two grow very close.

Meanwhile, Jonas is helping his family take care of a problem baby, Gabriel, who has trouble sleeping at night. Jonas helps the child to sleep by transmitting memories to him every night, and he begins to develop a relationship with Gabriel. When Gabriel is in danger of release, the Giver tells Jonas that release is the same as death. The Giver and Jonas plan for Jonas to escape the community and to actually enter Elsewhere. However, Jonas is forced to leave earlier than planned when his father tells him that Gabriel will be released the next day. Jonas steals his father's bicycle and a supply of food and sets off for Elsewhere. He enters a place full of color, but also hunger and exhaustion. Comforting Gabriel with memories of sunshine, Jonas mounts a high hill. There he finds a sled waiting for him at the top. Riding down the hill, they see the twinkling lights of a friendly village at Christmas, and they hear music. Jonas understands that someone is waiting for them.

My opinion: The book is quite easy to read. At first the life in this society seems smooth and positive, but later you learn how cruel it is. You can appreciate our ability to make our own choices in everyday life.

Recommendation: I would recommend this book for young adults who like books such as Hunger Games or Divergent, depicting some new type of society where people are not allowed to make their personal choice.

Antoine de Saint-Exupery "The Little Prince"

In case the pilot finds his dead body, it will only mean that the body was too heavy to carry it to another planet. The Prince walks away, and the snake bites him.


The pilot can't find the Prince's dead body. He fixes the plane and leaves the desert.

Marie Lu "Warcross" and "Wildcard"




Who is your favourite character and why? Jayni, I loved the way she helped mom to look after her little Brother and didn't want to spend all the




J. K Rowling "Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban"






Sir Arthur Conan Doyle "The Adventures Of Sherlock Holmes"




